The decision

Rax has made FIIoT a strategic priority. ● Rax-supplied S3 The evidence supports growing it, but not as a thirteen-model catalogue sold to end users. Grow it as engineering sold inside other companies' products and contracts: connected controller cards and design fees for Indian equipment OEMs, and an AC, power and temperature kit that Rax's e-surveillance integrators bid to banks as a rental. In parallel, validate one calibrated 4G cold-chain module with a refrigeration OEM and a 20-unit Chennai pilot. Retire or fold the rest. The classification is Pilot first at 57 of 100 with medium confidence; three facts drove it: the OEM card business already repeats, bank RFPs already contain the kit's line items, and no FIIoT model is ready for a regulated end user. ● Rax-supplied S2 ● Verified S249 S42 ● Recommendation

Five findings that matter

First, FIIoT only sells as a component. The order book shows 500 softener cards each to Ion Exchange and Nuetch at ₹4,600, vending cards to SSP at ₹5,940, robot cards to Inforob and 100 Energy Gateway units to ANG, against four THAPS and four THOPS sensors to APAR at ₹6,000. No catalogue model other than THAPS and THOPS has an invoice, a tender award or a public deployment. ● Rax-supplied S2 ● Unknown

Second, the e-surveillance cross-sell is real but narrow. Central Bank of India's RFP for 3,000 ATM sites listed thermal sensing, mains and UPS sensing and optional remote AC control priced as a monthly rental, and RBI's July 2026 directions require banks to monitor environmental breaches at data-centre and DR sites. But the ATM estate fell to 2,51,057 in March 2025, specialist ATM site-monitoring vendors already exist, and the integrator decides whether to bid the line. ● Verified S249 S255 ● Publicly observed S253 S251

Third, readiness is the gap, and part of it is self-inflicted. No FIIoT model holds WPC ETA, MTCTE or CE; two datasheets nevertheless print a CE claim, and they claim no field calibration is ever needed, which conflicts with CDSCO's expectation of calibrated cold-chain monitors. Fixing the claims costs nothing; an ETA self-declaration costs ₹10,000 a model. ● Rax-supplied S3 S5 S6 ● Verified S42 S169

Fourth, buyers want uptime and open data, not features. The signals are about devices that go offline daily on Wi-Fi, solar pump monitors of which only 446 of 1,306 still transmitted, and data trapped in controller makers' portals. Nine of thirteen FIIoT models are Wi-Fi only, and the platform layer is priced at \$149 a month for 100 devices on ThingsBoard, so RT-SW-FIIOT should be a free white-label layer with open export, not a product. ● Publicly observed S106 ● Verified S216 S108 ● Rax-supplied S4

Fifth, the market is bigger than Rax can serve. The four addressable families total about ₹926 Cr a year in 2026 and Rax can serve about ₹228 Cr, but with two salespeople and a booked hardware team it can obtain about ₹0.8 Cr in 2026 and about ₹8 Cr by 2031 if it wins one OEM design-in a quarter. ● Estimated S2 S3

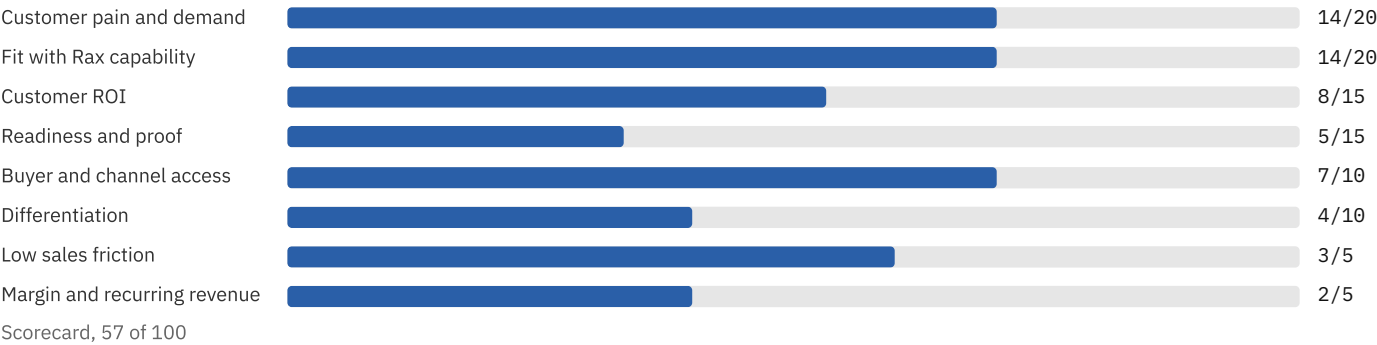
What would change the verdict

Up to Sell now: two new OEM design agreements and an integrator rate card signed by mid-2027, with 97% data availability on installed units and a costed hardware margin of 45% or more. Down to Validate before selling: the reliability audit of ANG and APAR units shows chronic failures, or Ion Exchange and Nuetech stop reordering. Down to Bundle: no integrator will bid the kit and the cold-chain pilot yields no paying reference, leaving FIoT as engineering inside ZenCampus, rack monitoring and OEM work only. ● Recommendation

The product master lists thirteen FIOT models and one platform. Grouped by the buyer they would serve, they fall into seven families, and the grouping matters more than the model numbers because each family has a different regulator, competitor set and price band.

The RT-DFI-G flyer, January 2026: the product claim is temperature and humidity monitoring with 4G and location tracking, but the flyer carries no accuracy, range, logging interval or battery figure, and it labels the Wi-Fi and GSM variants with the same code. Source S4 S15

What is verified versus claimed

Nothing about any FIoT model is independently verified. The internal record is unambiguous on the certification position: ISO 9001:2015 from Bureau Veritas is held since 22 September 2025 with a scope that names IoT products and customised hardware and software design; ZED Silver is held; BIS CRS is applied for and in process; RoHS is claimed; TEC MTCTE, CE, UL and SABER are not held. Rax-supplied S3 The two technical datasheets nevertheless print "CE certified, RoHS compliant, ISO 9001:2015" on their certification line, which a European or GCC buyer would read as a declaration of conformity and could later test. Rax-supplied S5 S6 The Saudi research recorded the same discrepancy for the rack controller and asked for the underlying certificates; none were supplied. Rax-supplied S19

The edge gateway datasheet is the most complete document in the line and is still short of what an industrial buyer asks for: it gives I/O counts, protocols and a 9 to 36 V DC supply, but no CPU, memory, tag limits, Modbus register capacity, operating temperature, EMC standard, surge rating, TLS or certificate handling, offline buffer size or secure-boot statement. Rax-supplied S5 The Saudi dossier listed those same unknowns as the reason the gateway cannot be sold as a generic gateway until a hardware matrix is published. Rax-supplied S16

The cold-chain flyers are the weakest relative to their regulated market. Both freezer variants are labelled RT-DFI-GO on the flyer while the site calls them RT-DFI-W and RT-DFI-G; the Wi-Fi flyer also claims worldwide GSM and location tracking. No accuracy, probe type, calibration traceability, logging interval, memory, alarm delay or battery backup is stated. Rax-supplied S4 S8 Rax-supplied S15 A pharmacy, blood bank or vaccine store buying under CDSCO Good Distribution Practice needs calibrated equipment checked at defined intervals with records kept for shelf life plus one year; the flyer cannot be used to answer any of those questions. Verified S42

The SOS device datasheet is specific on the user-facing behaviour (three presses, two contacts, SMS plus voice call with a recorded message, 15-day standby, 45-minute charge, GPS position in the alert, OTA update) but silent on the things a safety programme buyer checks: the cellular module and its certification, the fall-back when GPRS is unavailable, tamper and low-battery reporting, and where the tracking software stores location data. Rax-supplied S6 Location and emergency-contact data of women, children and elders is personal data under the Digital Personal Data Protection Act, whose Rules were notified on 14 November 2025 with penalties up to ₹250 Cr for failing reasonable security safeguards; the datasheet does not mention the Act. Verified S67

The AI condition-monitoring model RT-ICM has no datasheet, flyer or price. The Saudi dossier could verify only that the product identity exists in the catalogue and placed it against Samotics, Artesis, ABB and SKF, all of which publish measurement principles and case studies. Rax-supplied S17 Until Rax publishes what the device measures (current signature at the MCC or vibration at the asset), what faults it claims to detect and on what evidence, RT-ICM should be treated as a concept, not a product. Inferred

Installed base and references

The order book for FY2024-25 and FY2025-26 contains no line for RC01, RC03, LS08, DFI, WQF, ATU, Z01, Z03, SOS or IEI. The only FIoT-branded lines are four THAPS and four THOPS environment sensors sold to APAR Innosys at ₹6,000 each in November 2025, and one "EML IOT UNIT" at ₹5,000 to MRS, which belongs to the X-Lite emergency-light line. Rax-supplied S2 APAR Innosys is a top-six e-surveillance account, so even that sale is an existing-account add-on rather than an IoT market win. Rax-supplied S3

By contrast, the unbranded contract-design work that uses the same engineering is real and repeating: 500 water-softener cards to Ion Exchange (LOI/013/25-26, September 2025) and 500 to Nuotech (April 2026) at ₹4,600 each, solar-panel-cleaner cards to Inforob at ₹5,450 to ₹8,500 (over 170 units across two years), PSIP vending V5 cards to SSP Beverage at ₹5,940 (100 units), Energy Gateway units with TLS

sensors to ANG (100 units), and level-sensor and IR-sensor cards to Pradeep Kitchen in hundreds. Rax-supplied S2 Rax's own site shows the Ion Exchange softener controller as a "custom solution, courtesy Ion Exchange", which is the only public IoT reference the company has. Publicly observed S12

No public deployment, case study, tender award or marketplace listing for any FIIoT model was found in this research (searches: "Rax Tech IoT", "FIIoT app", model numbers, IndiaMART and GeM catalogue searches). Unknown The site's aggregate claims of 2M+ units sold and 1,200+ customers are unaudited marketing figures that mostly reflect the e-surveillance line and X-Lite. Publicly observed S11 Inferred

Service model

Both technical datasheets state a one-year warranty and factory calibration with "no field calibration necessary for the life of this product". Rax-supplied S5 S6 The second statement is a problem for the cold-chain and water families, where the buyer's regulator expects periodic calibration of the monitoring equipment; a pH or ORP probe in particular drifts and needs buffer calibration. Verified S42 Inferred There is no AMC, spares or remote-support offer on record, and the e-surveillance installed base is served without AMC. Rax-supplied S3 The internal record also carries the constraint that shapes everything in this report: frequent support calls including at installation, sample-based QC on large orders, missed urgent deliveries from component dependency, and a market reputation the sales lead describes as bad. Readiness gaps ranked by commercial impact

1. No certificates. BIS CRS is only relevant if a model falls under a notified category; WPC ETA is what every 2.4 GHz and 865 to 867 MHz product needs to be sold legally, and it is available by self-declaration with an ISO 17025 RF test report; MTCTE applies to the cellular and gateway models. 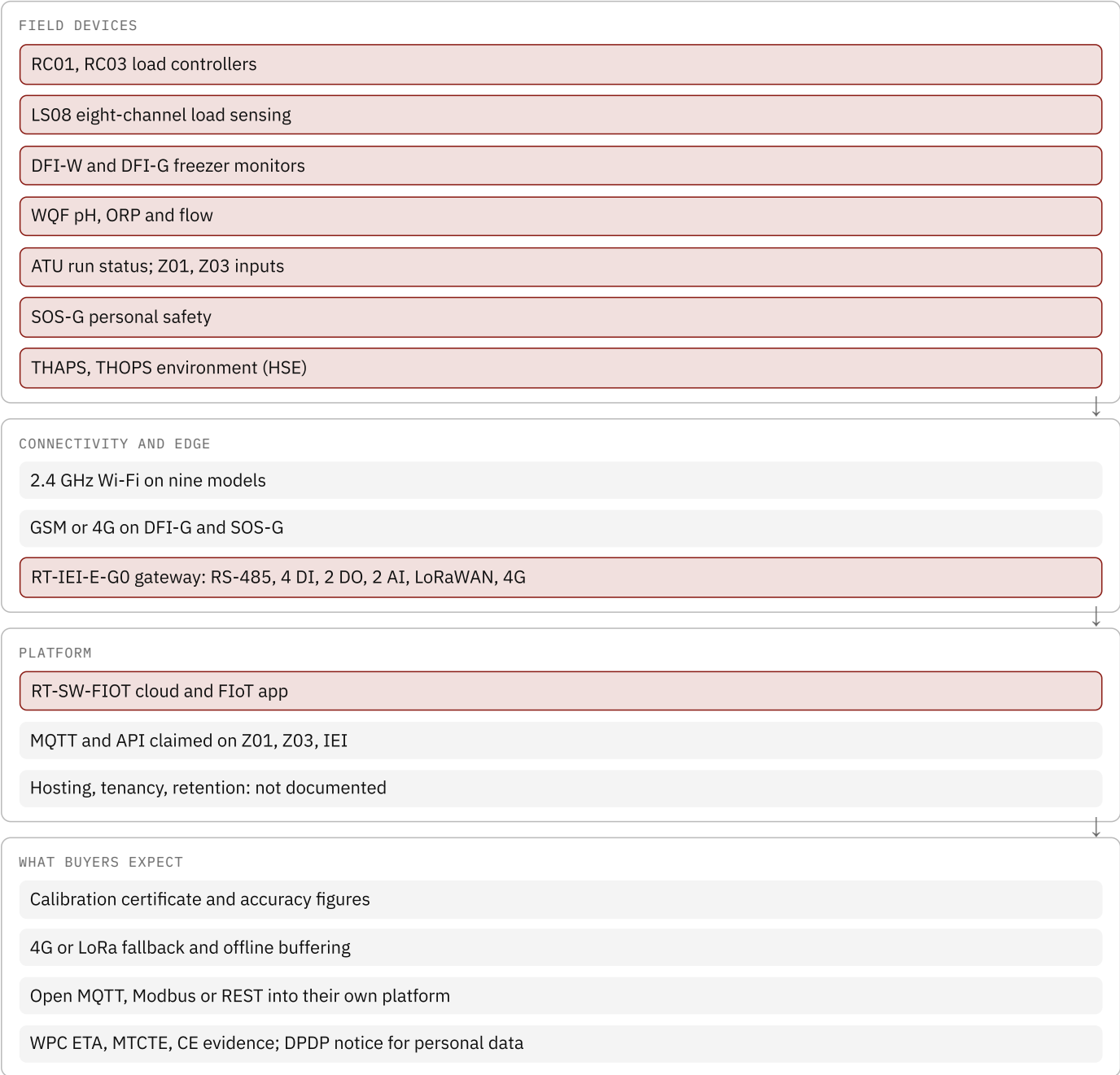
Adjacent Rax products that bundle naturally

The FIIoT app is already the common platform for THAPS, THOPS, SOS and the Wi-Fi clock, so any HSE sale drags the platform along. Publicly observed S9 The rack controller shares the same environmental sensors and the same central-software pattern and is the only Rax IoT-adjacent product with a paying reference. Rax-supplied S3 The alarm panels and EVA edge boxes sold to SIS, Securens and APAR are installed at bank and ATM sites that also need temperature and power monitoring, which is exactly what the Energy Gateway to ANG appears to be. Rax-supplied S2 Inferred ZenCampus lists environment, energy and water monitoring modules that would be delivered with these same devices. Rax-supplied S3

SO WHAT FOR RAX

The honest product truth is that Rax has a working device-and-app stack and a contract-design business that sells IoT boards in thousands, but no FIIoT catalogue model with a specification, a certificate or a customer. Every later section should be read as "what would this family need to become a product", not "how do we sell this product". Recommendation

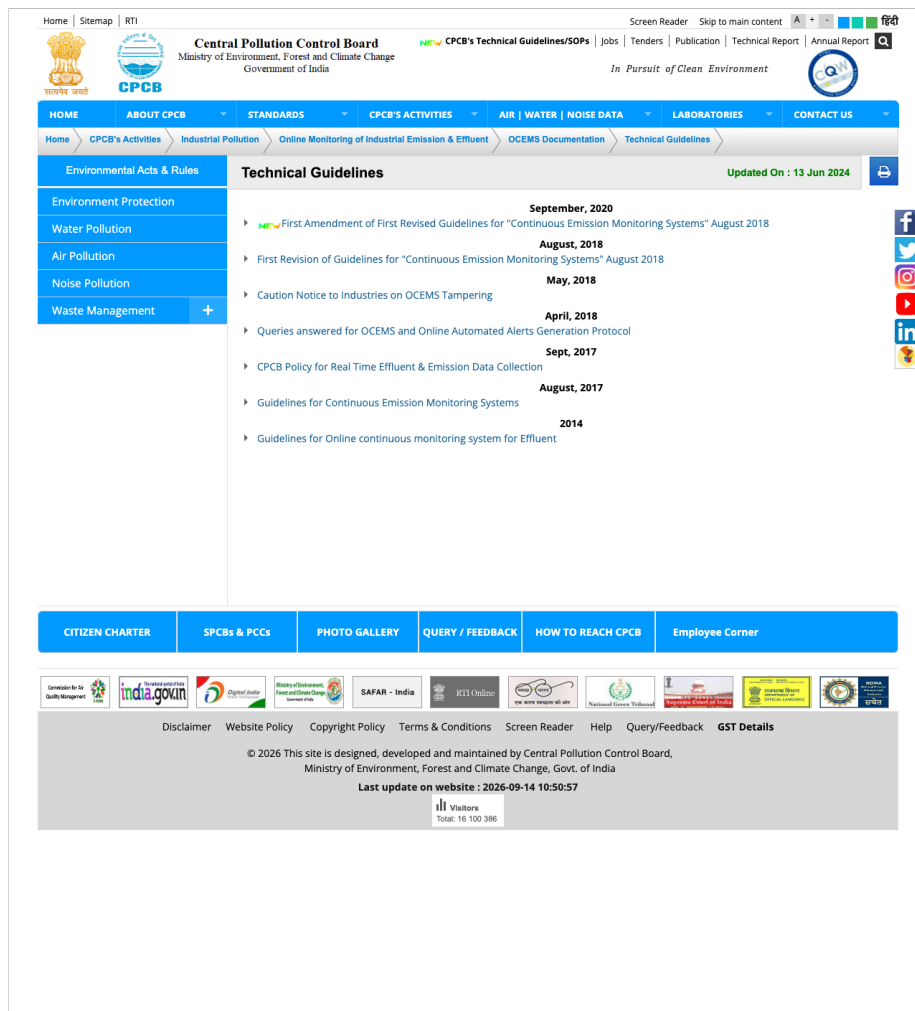
The category and its boundaries

The thirteen models are marketed under one brand, so the temptation is to size "IoT in India" and take a share. That is the wrong denominator. 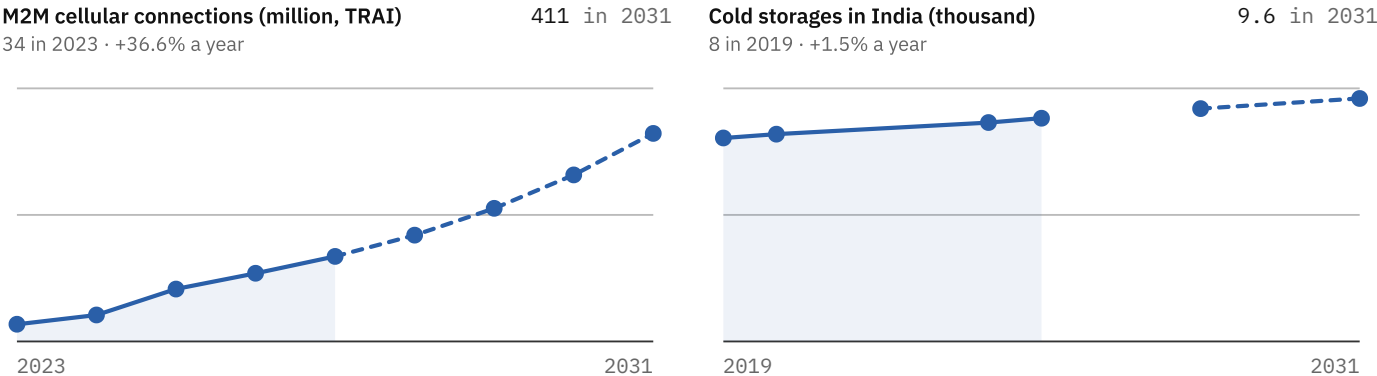

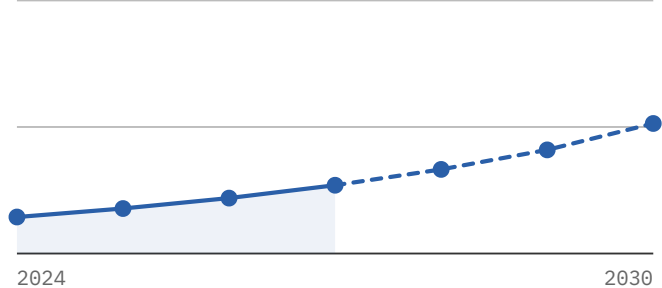

Grand View Research estimates Indian IoT device revenue at USD 2,885.5 million in 2024 growing 23.2% a year to USD 10,276.8 million by 2030; the interpolated 2026 value is about USD 4,380 million, or roughly ₹37,700 Cr at an assumed ₹86 to the dollar. The ₹926 Cr bottom-up TAM is 2.5% of that.

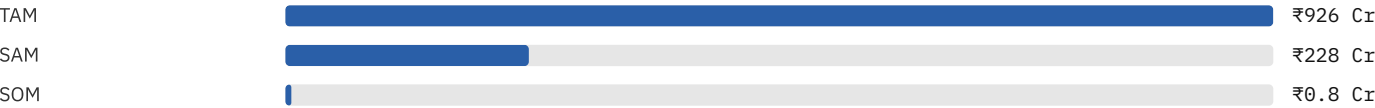

Why the top three rank where they do

The OEM controller segment wins on fit and readiness because it is the only place Rax has repeat purchase orders. Ion Exchange and Nuetech each ordered 500 softener controller cards at ₹4,600, SSP Beverage bought vending cards at ₹5,940 and Inforob took more than 170 robot cards; no certificate was a gate because the OEM's finished product carries the compliance, and no reference was needed because the OEM tested the card itself. Rax-supplied S2 Differentiation scores only 7 because Kaynes, Syrma SGS, Elecbits and Chennai design houses sell the same service; Syrma's ODM revenue alone reached ₹269 Cr in one quarter. The integrator segment ranks second on access, not on demand. SIS, Securens, APAR and ANG already hold purchase relationships with Rax, and two of them bought FIoT hardware without any marketing. Pharmacies, blood banks and pharma plants have the clearest written obligation in this report: CDSCO's distribution guideline asks for calibrated monitors and records kept for shelf life plus one year, and revised Schedule M asks for monitored conditions with validated computer systems. Buying committee

The committee diagram below lists six roles for the OEM and cold-chain segments. In the OEM segment the R&D or product head is the champion and the purchase head the economic buyer; the deal dies on unit price or a missed delivery, which the context file records as a Rax weakness from component dependency. In the cold-chain segment the QA manager who "reviews temperature data of data loggers" is the champion, and the deal dies on a missing calibration certificate. Case study one: the Ion Exchange and Nuetech softener controller (segment 1)

Rax designed a connected controller for water softeners and supplies it unbranded. Ion Exchange placed a letter of intent in September 2025 for 500 cards and Nuetech ordered 500 in April 2026, both at ₹4,600 a card, and Rax's own website shows the controller as a custom solution "courtesy Ion Exchange". Rax-supplied S2 Publicly observed S12 Ion Exchange's consumer products revenue grew 33% in Q1 FY27, which is the growth the card rides on. Publicly observed S127

What made it work: the OEM specified the job, tested the card inside its own product and took the end-customer relationship; Rax needed no certificate beyond what the finished softener carries and no brand credibility with homeowners. What it does not prove: field failure rates, margin and whether Rax owns the firmware IP are all Unknown in the record. The lesson for the portfolio is that the FIoT app and Wi-Fi stack earn money as components inside an OEM's product. Unknown Inferred

Case study two: the ANG Energy Gateway and APAR THAPS add-ons (segment 2)

ANG bought about 100 Energy Gateway units with TLS sensors at ₹3,450 to ₹3,900, and APAR Innosys bought four THAPS and four THOPS environment sensors at ₹6,000 each in November 2025; both are e-surveillance integrators that install Rax panels at bank sites. Rax-supplied S2 These are the only FIoT-branded or FIoT-derived sales in two years that reached an end site, and they arrived with no marketing because the integrator already had a Rax purchase relationship. The warning in the same record: ANG's revenue to Rax fell by ₹2.02 Cr in FY2025-26, attributed to quality and service failures. A monitoring add-on generates alarms that the bank sees, so a device that drops offline damages the integrator's standing faster than an alarm panel that sits quietly. Any expansion here must start with a reliability fix, not a price list. Rax-supplied S3 Recommendation

Case study three: connected coolers and refrigerators (segment 3)

Coca-Cola India piloted connected coolers with Vodafone Idea Business Services and eBest IoT in 2018, with a sensor for temperature, humidity and door opening and location tracking so that partners could manage inventory and track where coolers were. Publicly observed S221 Elanpro launched IoT-enabled connected refrigerators in 2020 with a Smart Hub that monitors 20 units in a store, explicitly because brands that give refrigerators free to retailers could not track them, and built the vending side with Vendekin, whose own cloud tracks temperature and machine health. The pattern is that the brand defines the requirement, a telecom operator or platform provides connectivity, and the refrigeration OEM integrates a module. Rax can supply the module and white-label app to a second-tier OEM that lacks Elanpro's alliance, but only with a 4G variant: a cooler at a kirana store will not have Wi-Fi. Inferred Rax-supplied S4

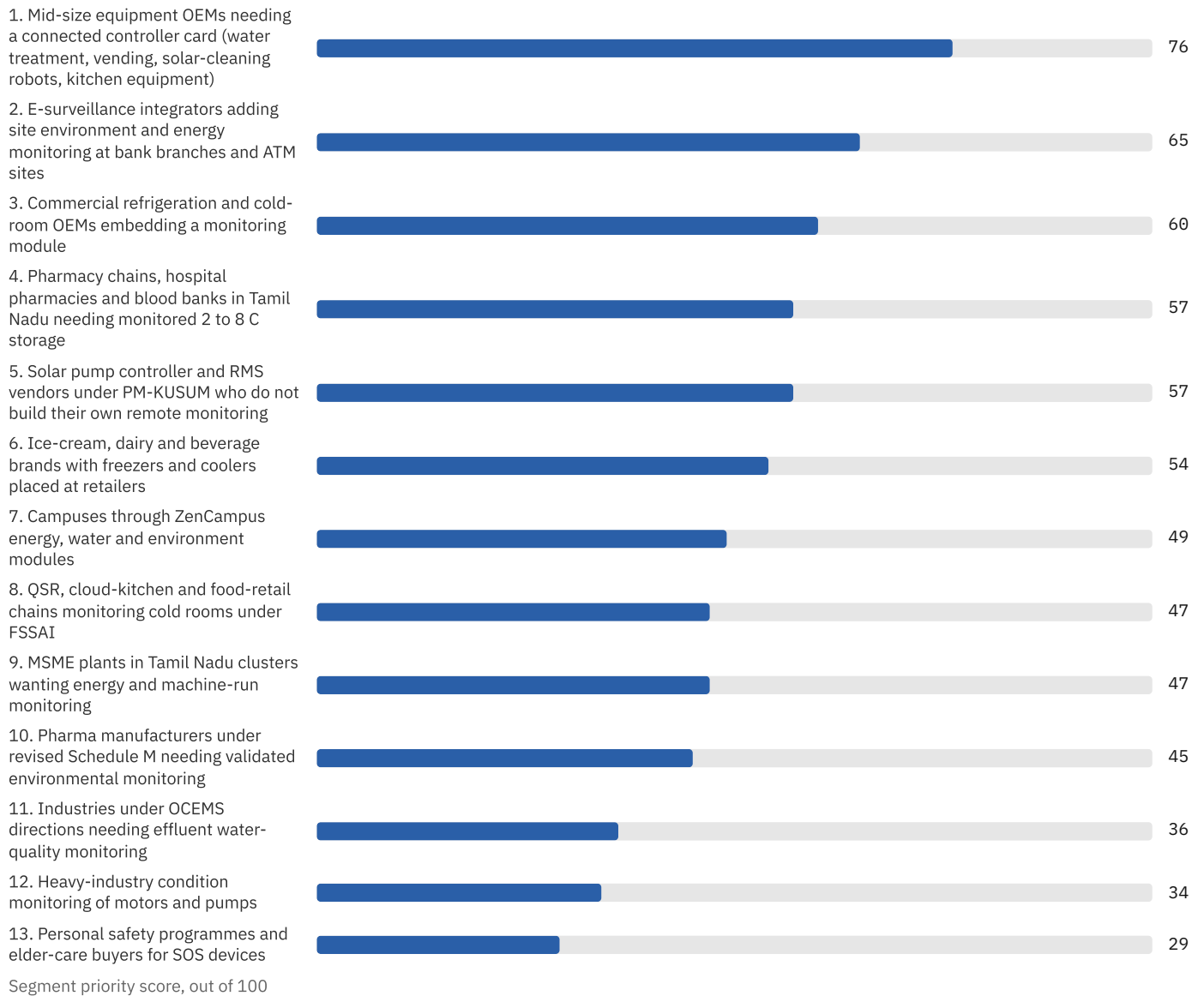

Arena one: cold chain and environment monitoring

The Indian mid-tier is represented by Hygroman, whose Wi-Fi or SIM logger lists at ₹12,500 to ₹22,000 with ± 0.5 C accuracy, a hooter, an OLED display, 150 days of local memory and IP64 ingress. That is the minimum specification a pharmacy or hospital buyer now sees as normal, and RT-DFI's flyer states none of those figures.

Below Hygroman sit the GSM alarm loggers on IndiaMART and Amazon: Adaptek of Chennai at ₹6,000, VEGA's GSM-20E at ₹6,500, Pyrotronics at ₹19,000, Innovator Automation at ₹18,500 with a server, Ace Instruments at ₹20,000, and Instrukart-class units that bundle a twelve-month calibration certificate as the selling point.

Above the mid-tier sit the GxP systems. Testo's Saveris 2-H1 is listed at ₹69,500 by a Mumbai dealer; ELPRO sells LIBERO cellular loggers with validation packs and pay-per-sensor cloud; Vaisala claims 3,200 life-science customers and 1,400 installed viewLinc systems. These are what a top-50 pharma QA manager who "reviews temperature data of data loggers" and approves excursions is used to.

TagBox is the Indian company that has bridged device and service. Its Rebel Foods deployment monitors kitchens and cold rooms in real time with FSSAI compliance framing, and it packages its own Tag360 sensors, TagHub gateways and AssetLens dashboards. GND Solutions markets the same bundle with revised Schedule M and ALCOA+ language.

SO WHAT FOR RAX

Arena two: energy, load and remote control

Zenatix is the reference brand. Acquired by Hero Electronix in 2018 and now sold as Zenatix by Schneider Electric, it monitors energy, temperature and assets across retail chains, QSRs and bank branches with wireless mesh sensors and claims 50,000 connected assets and a twelve to fourteen month payback. Publicly observed S176 S60 S59

Ecolibrium's SmartSense and Smart Joules' DeJoule occupy the enterprise decarbonisation end. Smart Joules raised \$10 million in December 2025 and sells cooling and efficiency as a service with no upfront capital, which removes the very budget line Rax's RC and LS devices would have to win. At the bottom of the arena sit the Wi-Fi relays and metering switches that RT-RC01, RT-RC03 and RT-LS08 most resemble. Sonoff's POWR320D 20 A metering switch is ₹3,649 on Amazon.in, Tuya modules are ₹950 on IndiaMART, and Shelly's Plus 1PM with local MQTT is ₹2,200. Infinite Uptime is the Indian success story, with 800 plants in about thirty countries, a \$35 million Series C in March 2025 and a cash-flow-positive business selling edge vibration sensors plus a reliability service to steel, cement, chemical and paper plants. Arena four: gateways, I/O, platforms and water

RT-IEI-E-G0 is the only Rax model with a full datasheet, and it lands in the most crowded arena. Teltonika's TRB140 sells at ₹11,000 on IndiaMART and ₹17,999 on Flipkart; Advantech's WISE-4050 Wi-Fi I/O module at ₹14,533; Milesight's UG65 LoRaWAN gateway at ₹45,068; Moxa's UC-8100 at ₹68,000 with UL and IEC ratings and a five-year warranty. Every one of those gateways carries CE, FCC or UL marks and a distributor network; Rax's datasheet claims CE that the internal record says is not held. Buyer reviews of Teltonika complain about buggy software and thin documentation, which is the one soft spot a well-supported Indian gateway could exploit. Platforms are substitutes for RT-SW-FIOT rather than competitors to it. ThingsBoard Community Edition is free, its Cloud tier is \$149 a month for 100 devices, AWS IoT Core connectivity costs about \$0.042 per device per year, Blynk starts at \$29 a month and Tuya's IoT Core charges \$3.15 per million API calls. Water is its own sub-arena. Kritsnam's Dhaara ultrasonic meters carry OIML R49 type approval and NABL calibration, and the company sells a managed water-accounting service at ₹18 to 30 lakh per plant per year to 2,000 facilities; FluxGen raised ₹28 Cr in 2025 with Tata Steel as a reference; LogicLadder pushes analyser data to CPCB and SPCB servers. TagBox Solutions

TagBox is a Bengaluru company whose AssetLens platform combines its own Tag360 sensors, TagHub gateways and cloud analytics. Its Rebel Foods contract put real-time temperature, door and energy monitoring across cloud kitchens with an FSSAI compliance narrative, and it lists 50+ organisations across India and APAC. It is angel and IAN funded and won a National Startup Award in 2021. ● Publicly observed S51

Strengths: it sells to a compliance owner, not to a plant electrician; it controls hardware and software; it has a named reference in the exact QSR segment where Rax’s THAPS sensors could sit. Weaknesses: pricing is quote-only and the company is small enough that a single large account dominates. Expected response to Rax: none, unless Rax lands a QSR chain, in which case TagBox would undercut on the software layer.

Strengths: an enterprise sales motion, the Schneider channel with 4,000+ EcoXpert partners, and a payback claim that finance directors accept. Weaknesses: it does not chase single plants or MSMEs, which leaves the segment Rax could reach. Expected response: Schneider partners would be told to position EcoStruxure Machine Advisor and Zenatix against any Rax pilot that reaches a multi-site chain.

Infinite Uptime

Infinite Uptime, founded in Pune, sells edge vibration and process sensors with AI diagnostics and a reliability service; it reports 800 plants in about thirty countries, cash-flow positivity and a \$35 million Series C in March 2025 led by Avataar Ventures with Tiger Global participating.

Strengths: a decade of plant references, proprietary sensors rated for hot and dusty environments, and a service model that ties revenue to uptime. Weaknesses: heavy-industry focus and per-plant pricing that MSMEs cannot absorb. Kritsnam Technologies

Kritsnam, out of IIT Kanpur and based in Hyderabad, makes the Dhaara ultrasonic water meter with dual-SIM 4G telemetry, holds OIIML R49 type approval, NABL calibration and a Legal Metrology licence, and reports 2,000+ facilities. It sells a managed water-accounting service at ₹18 to 30 lakh per plant per year on top of meters priced from ₹25,000. ● Publicly observed S118 S119

Strengths: it sells an audited outcome that satisfies CGWA and state boards, and the certificates are the moat. Weaknesses: flow only, no water quality. Teltonika Networks

Teltonika, from Vilnius, sells the TRB140 LTE gateway and RUT routers through multiple Indian distributors at ₹11,000 to ₹18,000 with MQTT, SNMP, VPN and its RMS remote management service. Reviews praise reliability and price but complain about buggy firmware, thin documentation and support. Publicly observed S93 S94 S95 S96

Strengths: certification, five-year design life, a mature remote management platform and stock availability in India. Weaknesses: software quality complaints and no local engineering. Where Rax wins and loses

Rax wins where it has already won: an OEM that needs a controller card with connectivity at ₹3,450 to ₹5,940, designed and supplied from Chennai with tooling and firmware Rax owns. Ion Exchange, Nuetch, ANG, SSP Beverage and Inforob bought exactly that. No competitor in this set sells that combination at that price with local engineering. Rax-supplied S2 Inferred

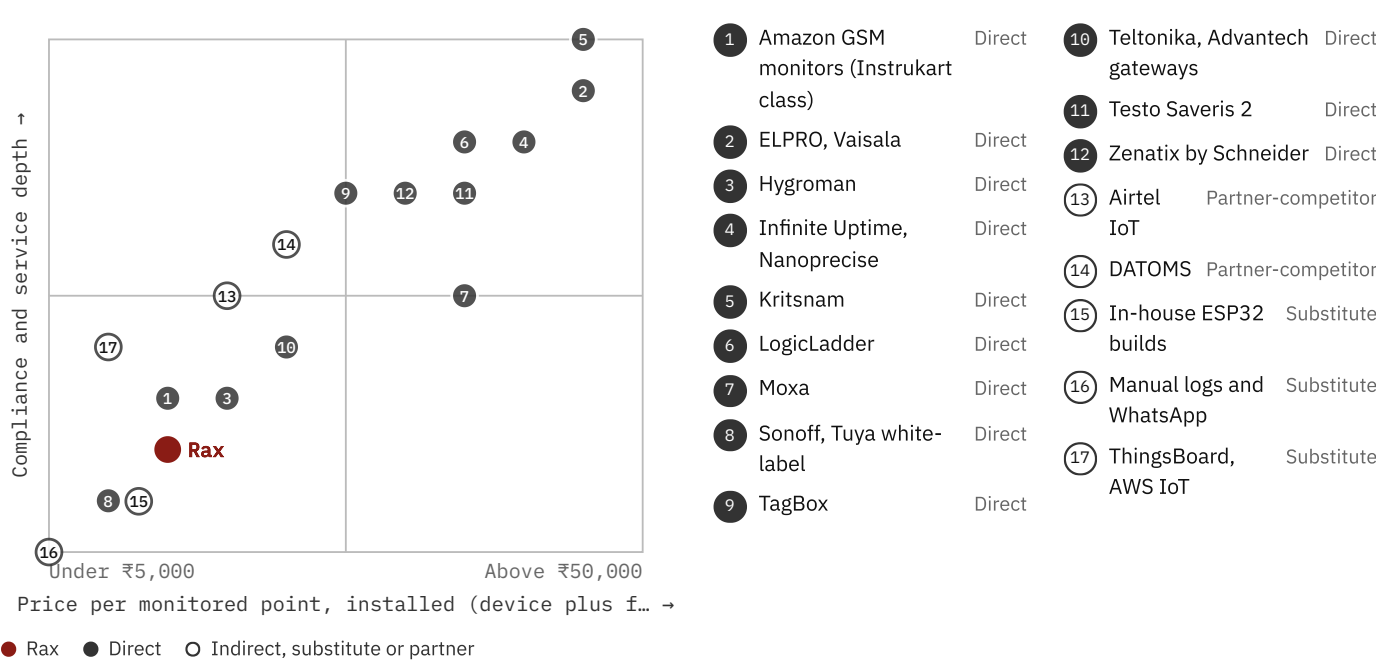
Rax loses wherever the buyer asks for a certificate, an accuracy figure, a SIM option, a calibration report or a service contract, which is every regulated buyer in arenas one, three and four. It also loses on the platform, where ThingsBoard, AWS and Tuya make RT-SW-FIOT unsaleable as a product. Publicly observed S82 S203 S118 S108 Rax-supplied S3 S4

Buyers' complaints about incumbents are a map of the wedges: Wi-Fi drop-outs (Sonoff, Tuya), buggy software (Teltonika), price and calibration cost (Testo, Vaisala), enterprise-only pricing (Zenatix, Infinite Uptime). A Rax offer that fixed the first two by shipping a 4G or LoRa option with a Chennai support line, and the third by bundling calibration, would have a story. Competitor responses to expect

If Rax gains share as an OEM board supplier, the response comes from DATOMS and the Chennai integrators, who would offer the OEM a platform plus a commodity board. If Rax gains share in cold-chain devices, TagBox and Hygroman would compete on service and specification, and the marketplace sellers would compete on price. If Rax gains share in gateways, Teltonika's distributors would bundle RMS. In every case the response arrives within a quarter and costs the competitor nothing structural. 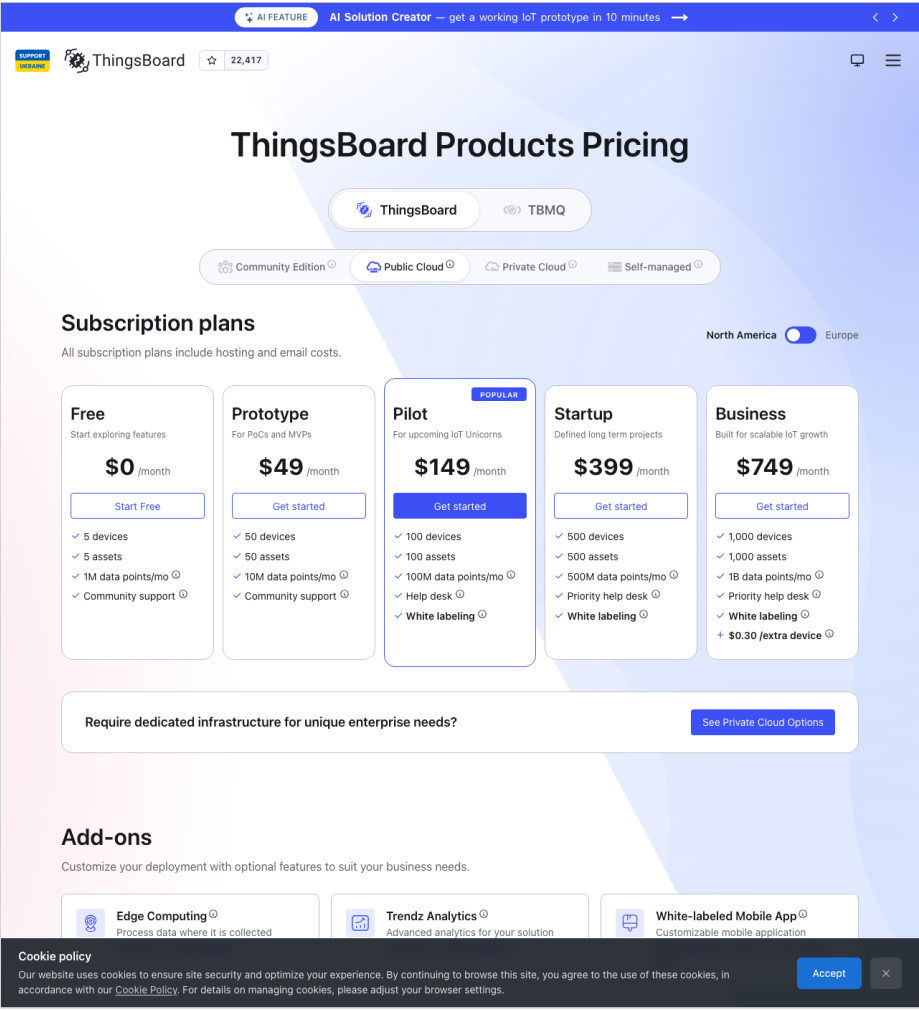

Rax's current pricing and how it compares

The order book gives five Rax IoT price points. FIOT-THAPS and FIOT-THOPS sold at ₹6,000 each to APAR Innosys in November 2025. The Energy Gateway with sensors sold at ₹3,450 to ₹3,900 to ANG across about a hundred units. Softener controller cards sold at ₹4,600 to Ion Exchange and Nuetech, solar-robot cards at ₹5,450 to ₹8,500 to Inforob, and the vending V5 card at ₹5,940 to SSP Beverage.

Rax-supplied S2

Against the market, ₹6,000 for a Wi-Fi temperature and humidity sensor is at the top of the Amazon range (₹2,489) and at the bottom of the IndiaMART GSM logger range (₹6,000 to ₹20,000), but those GSM loggers include a SIM slot, SMS alarms and in some cases a calibration certificate that THAPS does not. The OEM card prices compare well. The recommended architecture for the one branded family worth pursuing is device plus service: a ₹9,000 to ₹12,000 THAPS or DFI unit with a SIM option and a calibration certificate, plus ₹150 to ₹250 a month for SIM, cloud and alerting, sold to compliance owners in pharmacies, blood banks and QSR kitchens. That lands below Hygroman on device price and far below Testo, while carrying the three things buyers ask for.

\$0.042 per device per year is what AWS charges to keep a device connected to IoT Core around the clock; the entire platform layer for 1,000 Rax devices would cost less than one THAPS unit.

Cost-to-serve and margin hypotheses

COGS for every FIoT model is Unknown; the internal record contains no bill of materials. What can be bounded from public component prices is the floor: an ESP32 module at ₹400 to ₹1,200, a temperature and humidity sensor at ₹150 to ₹5,000 depending on grade, an enclosure and power supply, and a 4G modem board at ₹2,000 to ₹6,000.

Working from that floor, a ₹6,000 THAPS unit built on ESP32 with a mid-grade sensor is plausibly at 40 to 55 percent gross margin before calibration, packaging and warranty; a SIM variant at ₹9,000 to ₹12,000 with a ₹2,000 to ₹3,000 modem retains a similar margin. The plan needs at least 45 percent gross on hardware and 60 percent on the service line for the pilot to carry a support engineer.

Recommendation

Calibration is the hidden cost. Instrukart-class listings bundle a twelve-month factory calibration certificate; a NABL-traceable certificate from a third-party lab is a per-unit cost and an annual recurrence that the buyer will expect Rax to organise. The amount is Unknown and must be quoted from a Chennai lab before any price is set.

Subsidy and scheme effects

Three schemes change the buyer's effective price. ADEETIE offers interest subvention on energy-efficiency equipment for MSMEs, which lowers the cost of a monitored retrofit rather than the device. Tamil Nadu's capital subsidy for scaling MSMEs and the RAMP programme fund modernisation projects into which an IoT line item can be written. None of them names IoT devices specifically.

Without those, the price is irrelevant.

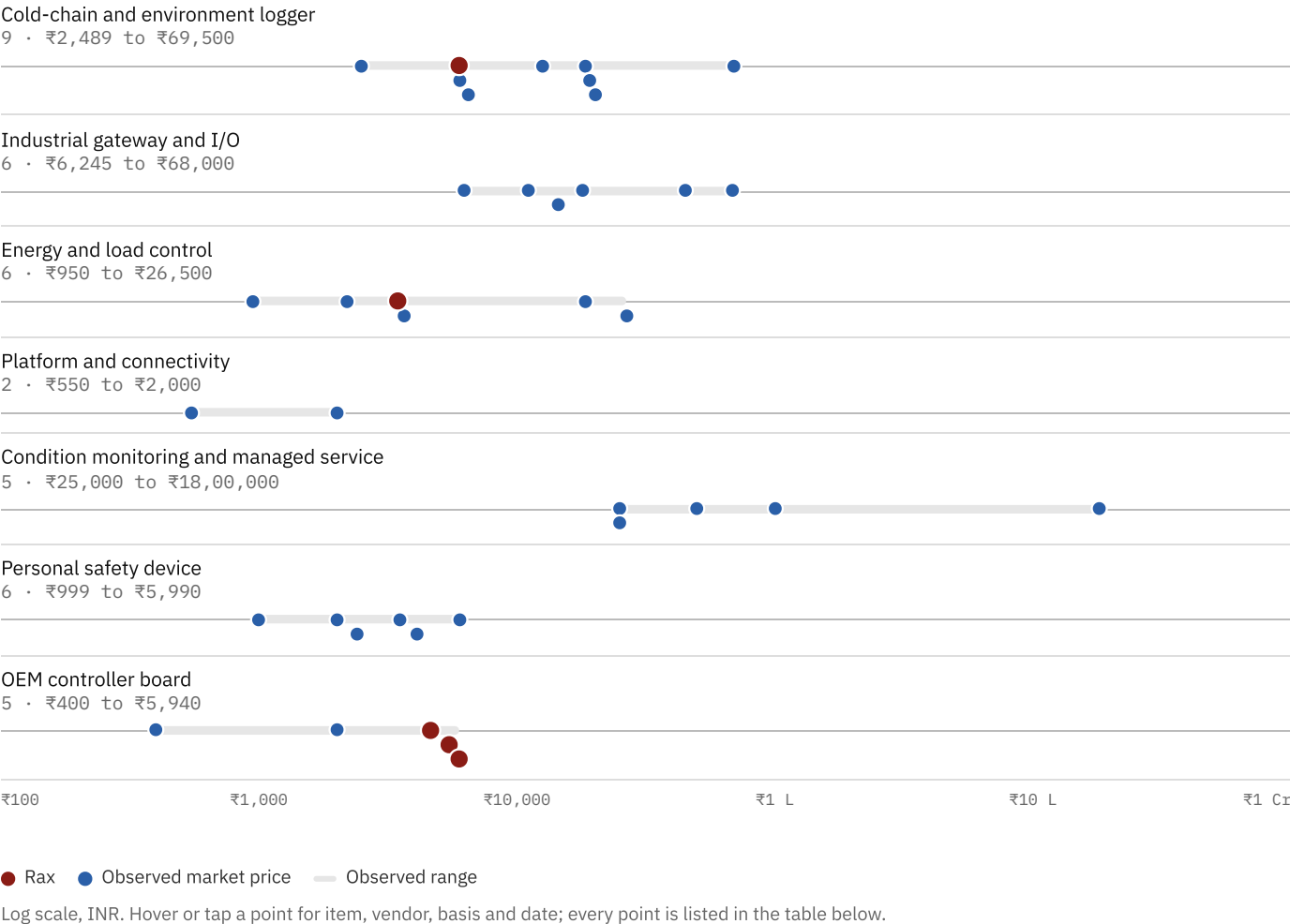
Payment terms and receivable risk by segment

OEM accounts pay on delivery or thirty days; the order book shows repeat orders from Ion Exchange, Nuetech and ANG, which is the lowest receivable risk Rax has. Pharmacy and hospital chains pay on sixty to ninety days and expect annual contracts. Public tenders pay after inspection and can stretch past 120 days. Single MSME plants pay on delivery but churn on service.

SO WHAT FOR RAX

Price is not what stops Rax selling FIoT devices; the ₹6,000 sensor and ₹4,600 board are competitive. What stops the sale is the absence of the certificate, the SIM option and the service line that every buyer above the Amazon tier now assumes are included in the price.

The constraint that shapes every route

Rax has two full-time salespeople and one part-time technical person, inbound enquiries arrive through Google and IndiaMART, new-customer prospecting is effectively nil, referrals are dead by the sales lead's own account, and digital marketing agencies and channel partners with their own sales teams have both been tried and failed. Hardware and firmware engineering is booked while software engineering has free bandwidth.

Rax-supplied S3 Rax states that it is actively trying to grow FIoT and regards it as a strategic priority. Rax-supplied S3 The design problem for go-to-market is therefore how to grow FIoT revenue without adding a sales force and without exposing the brand to end users before the reliability record is fixed. The e-surveillance cross-sell route, tested

Rax states that it is a major e-surveillance player, and its customer base of ATM and bank e-surveillance service companies is the most obvious place to cross-sell FIIoT devices.

Rax-supplied S3

 The evidence supports a real but narrow opportunity.

For it: bank RFPs have asked e-surveillance vendors for exactly the functions the FIIoT line provides. Central Bank of India's 2017 RFP for 3,000 ATM sites specified an ATM thermal sensor, mains and UPS power sensing, and "remote control of ACs and power consuming equipments" as an optional item priced as a monthly rental. UCO Bank's 2015 techno-functional BOQ included daily remote on and off of signage and air conditioners at each site.

 Rax has already sold Energy Gateway units to ANG and environment sensors to APAR, both e-surveillance integrators.

Rax-supplied S2

 Bank branches grew 2.8% to 1.64 lakh in FY2024-25, and RBI's 2026 technology risk directions ask banks to monitor breaches of environmental controls including temperature, water, smoke and power supply at data-centre and disaster-recovery sites, which is the rack-monitoring report's territory.

Against it: the ATM estate is shrinking, from 2,53,417 to 2,51,057 in FY2024-25, with private banks cutting fastest.

Procurement mechanics

OEM accounts buy through a letter of intent, a purchase order per lot and, for a new design, an engineering or NRE agreement; the Ion Exchange order began with an LOI. Rax should add written change-control and firmware-ownership terms, because the order book does not show who owns the design. ● Rax-supplied S2 ● Unknown

Bank e-surveillance RFPs set eligibility at the integrator level: Central Bank of India required the bidder to be providing e-surveillance at a minimum of 1,000 sites of at least two scheduled banks, a daily health check of every sensor through central monitoring and a quarterly physical check. A Rax device reaches a bank only as a component in that integrator's bid, and it must report into the integrator's central monitoring system. ● Verified S249

PM-KUSUM requires vendors to provide RMS, submit performance data online in the MNRE format, keep a service centre in each district and use indigenous controllers; the state agency tenders supply and installation to empanelled vendors. ● Verified S213 ● Publicly observed S219

Channel partners with their own sales teams failed because Rax asked them to create demand for Rax products. Digital marketing failed because FIoT had nothing a buyer could verify; the proposal here is to publish verifiable assets (corrected datasheets, a calibration certificate, a reliability report) on IndiaMART and rax-tech.com, not to buy traffic. ● Rax-supplied S3 ● Recommendation

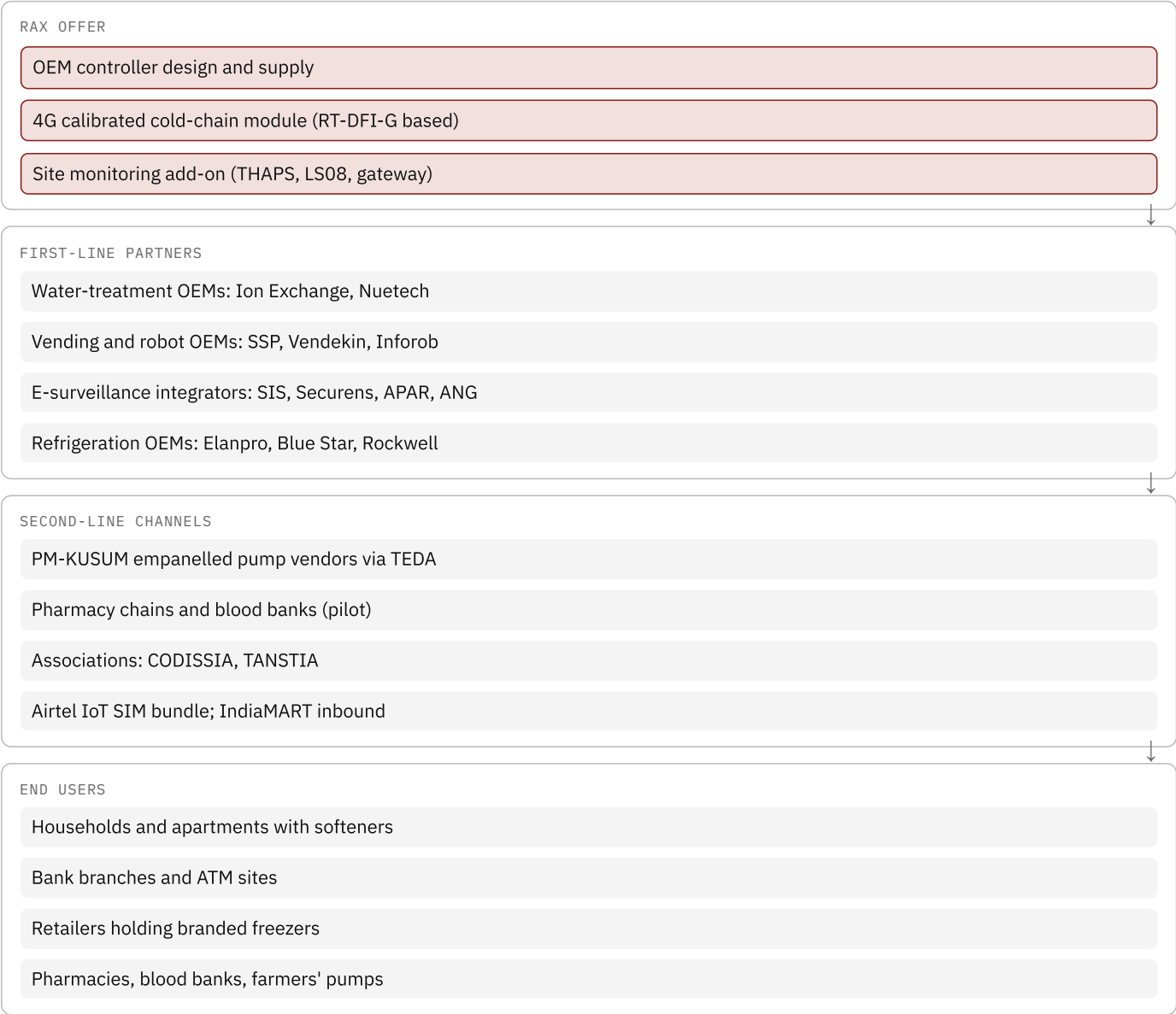

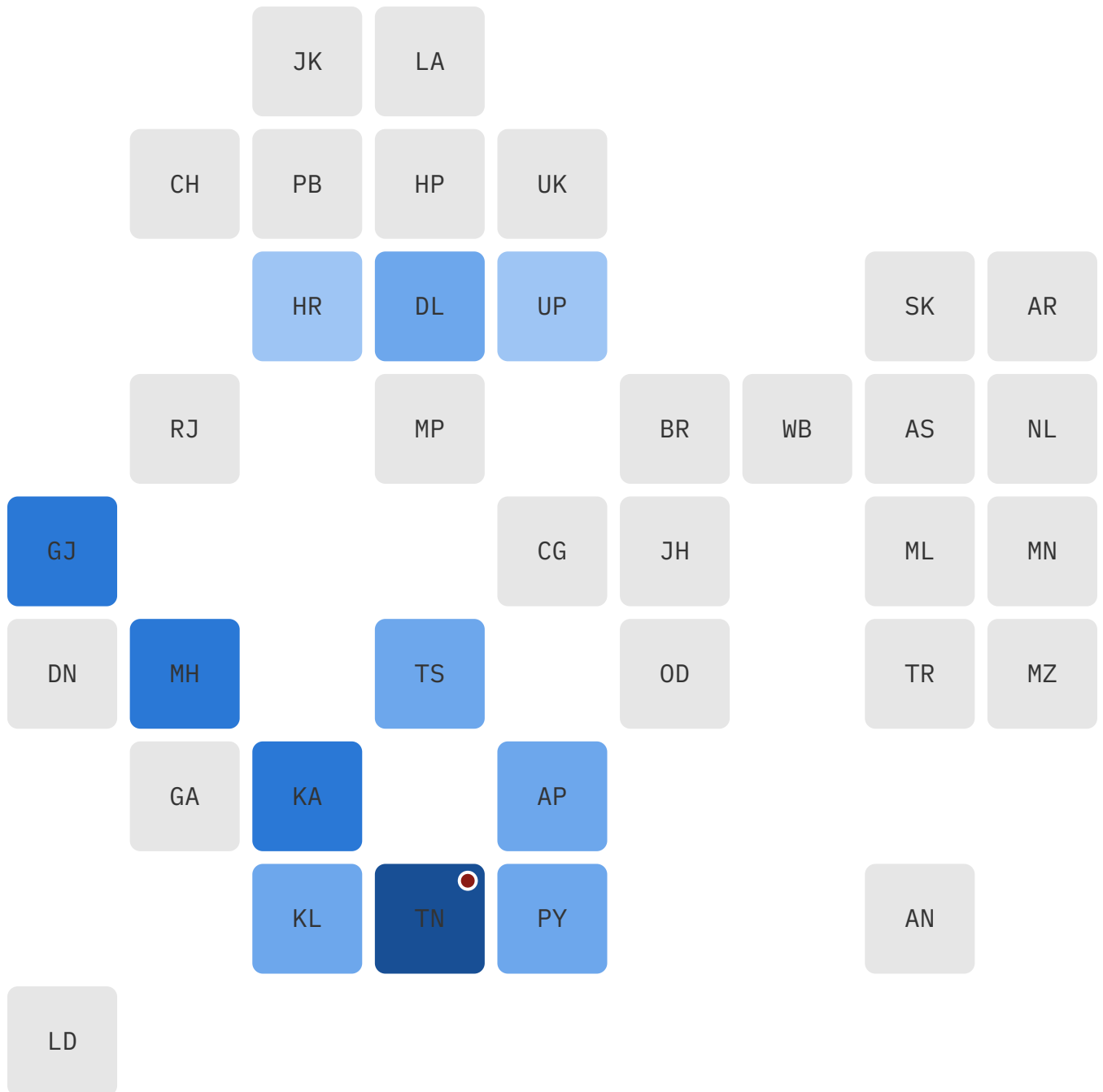

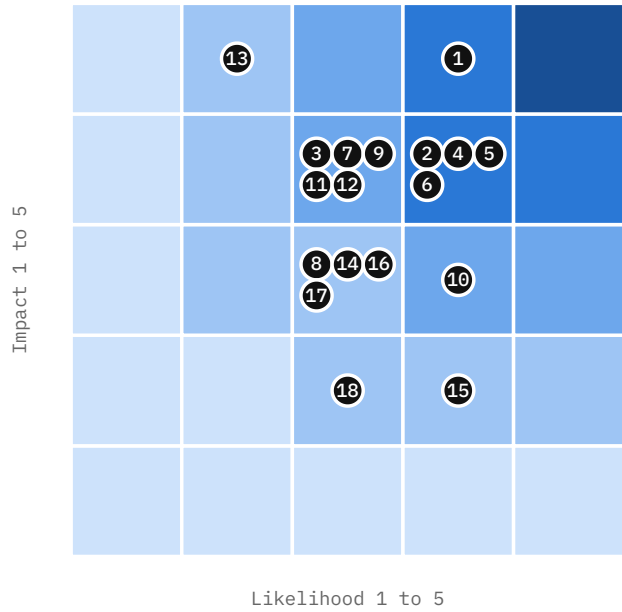

SO WHAT FOR RAX

Option B grows FIIoT faster than option A because it sells into demand that already exists inside Rax's accounts, and it uses the free software team for what buyers value (white-label apps, open data export, uptime reporting) instead of a platform nobody will pay for.

SO WHAT FOR RAX

Three internal documents (a costed BOM, a reliability report on installed units and the OEM contract terms) would do more to firm up this verdict than any further market research, and all three can be produced inside the first ninety days. Recommendation

Recommended next research actions

- 1. Obtain the costed BOMs and the installed-unit reliability data from Rax, and re-score readiness and margin. Recommendation
- 2. Hold account reviews with Ion Exchange, Nuetech and SSP to confirm 2027 volumes and whether they would accept a 4G variant. Recommendation

Changes between the first and second pass

The gap audit against the section briefs and the twelve prompt questions found five shortfalls, all closed in the second pass: the e-surveillance cross-sell route had no primary evidence (bank RFPs from Central Bank of India and UCO Bank and RBI's 2026 directions were added); the PM-KUSUM volume rested on a secondary summary (replaced with PIB Lok Sabha replies to December 2025); the personal-safety price category had three points (four marketplace prices added); two competitors that sell ATM site monitoring were missing (Maximus Infoware and Sixth Energy added); and one geography claim cited the wrong source (corrected).
